Case study: results of the Wesign project

Sweden - Stockholm

Background

The EU institutions and Member States show strong commitment to e-procedures. This has clearly be highlighted, among others, in the Services Directive that requires Points of Single Contact to be able to provide services electronically and in the Public Procurement Directives that promote the development and use of electronic means. A major challenge remains nevertheless to be solved: the issue of cross border recognition of e-Signatures.

End 2008 the European Commission adopted an action plan which aims to achieve interoperable e-signatures and e-identification of cross-border public services. With this action plan issues left open by the e-Signature Directive and its implementation by the Member States shall be accomplished.

In this complex environment, Chambers of Commerce in 13 European countries developed e-Signature related services. With the Wesign project supported financially by the European Commission, Chambers teamed to promote the development of e-Business and e-Government applications relying on digital certificates. Project partners succeeded among others to demonstrate the potential of some interoperable tools such as the Trust service Status List.

The conference organised in Stockholm will report on Wesign results and look at identifying the next challenges for reaching interoperability of e-Signature In Europe:

- Identification of key drivers such as the Services Directive implementation or e-Procurement
- Standardisation challenges ahead
- The role for Supervisory Authorities or other bodies such as ENISA, ETSI and the industry
- The implementation of Trust service Status Lists and its exploitation by certification service providers

The primary target audience for this conference are public authorities, representatives from EU institutions, business associations but also researchers and other specialists in the field of e-signatures.
